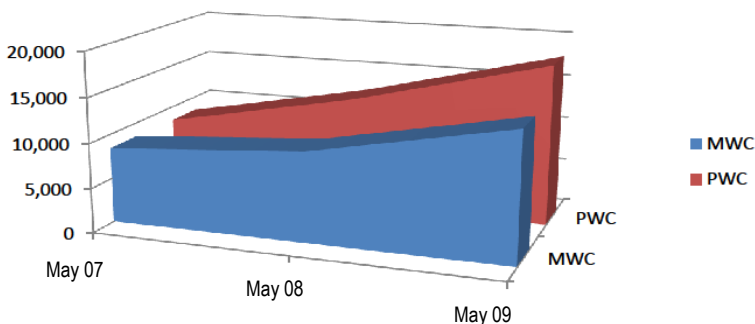

Local One-Stops Are the Place to Start a Job Search— Local NBC affiliate reported on the 26 year high unemployment rate during its 6 p.m. newscast on July 2, 2009, noting 467,000 people lost their jobs in June. Since December 2007 more than 253,700 Arizonans have lost their job—many are “still hurting for work.” Two Gilbert One-Stop Career Center customers were interviewed about their job searches. This newscast ended noting a local east valley employer is using the Gilbert Career Center to fill nearly 300 openings for a new store opening in the east valley.



Local One-Stops Expand Services via Access Points— On July 1 MWC and PWC, members of the Arizona Workforce Development Network, announced their collaboration with local faith- and community-based organizations to extend the reach of the state’s employment and training services valley wide; making it possible for job seekers to gain support and resources to look for jobs closer to their homes, with assistance from individuals trained by MWC and PWC to provide assistance similar to those offered at the local Workforce Connections One-Stop Career Centers. The initial 20+ participating One-Stop Access Points will receive assistance garnering surplus computers, employment resource materials and specialized training for volunteers and staff. Participating organizations are asked to provide volunteers, space and Internet access for job seekers.

August 12 Brings a Twist to a Traditional Career Expo — Jobing.com, in partnership with Maricopa Workforce Connections, will offer additional services to job seekers attending its August 12 Career Expo at the Jobing.com arena. Maricopa Workforce Connections will be offering on-site workshops covering Resume Instruction and Interview Techniques to hundreds of attendees. The open house highlighted resources available for job seekers including the Arizona Virtual One-Stop system, resume assistance, job search assistance, interview workshops and more. Phoenix First Workforce, an Access Point for Phoenix Workforce Connection, has assisted more than 100 people gain employment over the past eight weeks.
